

Prize-winning invention



Kelley Muir, president of Float Left Labs in Manchester, holds an infrared light pen she developed for use with a virtual white board program her company invented. The invention projects an image through a video projector onto a surface where the pen is used to draw, color and write, which is transmitted to the computer where it can be viewed. Float Left Labs is the first recipient of the New Hampshire Start-up Challenge competition grant of \$25,000 and in-kind and technical support sponsored by the Manchester Young Professionals Network.
